Dear Members

Celebrating over 90 years since the original charity was formed, 2026 is a good time to reflect on what remains from those early days. I believe these to be:-

The ethos of serving the community - staff who are proud to work at the hospital and volunteers who are the "backbone" of the Friends.

Local people and organisations supporting and funding the "Friends" - over 80% costs of all capital building works at the hospital.

A personal and friendly feel to the hospital which is highly valued - as seen by the comments on Facebook and letters we receive.

The highest standards of care as shown by the external accreditation of endoscopy and radiology departments.

People do sometimes ask "Why doesn't the NHS provide what you do?" I'd like to think that in its simplest terms **the Friends "reaches the parts the NHS budget cannot meet"**. We can only achieve what we do by working closely with NHS colleagues to understand the NHS pressures and priorities: to agree how **your** investment can be best used to support continuous improvement at the hospital

In this newsletter you will read about the progress that has been made over the last year and our plans for 2026. Predicting the future 90 years is speculative, but it will likely be influenced by developments in technology, demographic shifts like an ageing population and new models of care such as virtual wards and care in the community.

## HOW TIMES CHANGE



### A few interesting facts about the Friends of Victoria Hospital, Wimborne:-

In 1887, a meeting was called in Wimborne to discuss the forthcoming jubilee of Queen Victoria and how Wimborne should mark this. The proposal of a cottage hospital was up against 12 other ideas, including the provision of a town clock, the erection of a statue of Queen Victoria in the Square or indeed the erection of a statue of Queen Victoria in the square with a clock on the top!

How lucky are we, that the idea of a cottage hospital for the poor became the adopted proposal?

Sir Richard Glyn D.S.O was the first President, and the land was generously provided by Sir John Hanham, leased at a peppercorn rent. The first nurse matron was Miss Baker who was on duty, day and night. The hospital had 6 beds and depended on donations from the local community of food and goods.

In 1902 Sir Richard Glyn expressed the hope that the hospital might be a little more hygienic by separating the bath from the operating theatre. Local practitioners performed operations and visiting consultants started to expand activities.

During the First World War, 12-13 beds were used for the treatment of wounded soldiers requiring operations. Between both World Wars, a variety of new services were provided at the hospital reflecting the new developments in medicine such as an X-ray unit and a maternity ward and in 1948 it became part of the National Health Service, transitioning from its voluntary origins.

The Friends of Victoria Hospital (originally formed as the Wimborne Hospital League, in 1935) continue to support the delivery of first-class services at Wimborne Hospital.

The Hospital remains deeply connected to Wimborne, retaining its ethos of serving the community with strong backing from local residents and volunteers.

## Celebrating 90 Years

To celebrate 90 years of the Friends of Wimborne Hospital a short video was commissioned about the hospital and the work the Friends do to help.

Patients told us how grateful they were for the community hospital.

The Friends talked about the work they do to support the hospital and how they receive funding from legacies, the charity shop, fundraising activities and supporters and local organisations.

The video shows how the Hospital has benefited over the years and how 80% of all capital developments have been funded by local people supporting the Friends.

The video shows different departments at the Hospital, features both staff and patients as well as trustees of the Friends and our local charity shop.

The aim was to bring greater awareness to the quality of work that takes place at the hospital and the work of the Friends in supporting this.

## Minor Injuries Unit (MIU) and Physiotherapy Department

Members will be aware that a long standing ambition for the Friends has been to improve both the Physiotherapy and the Minor Injuries Unit.

Plans have been drawn up and approved for work to commence in March 2026 once the car park project has been finally completed.

The project will support an increase in paediatric and primary care treatment rooms in MIU, with greater privacy for patients.

The Physiotherapy Department will have an improved gym and spaces which will also enable greater privacy and confidentiality. The development will provide greater flexibility and an enhanced working environment for both patients and staff.
